COVID-19 Frequently Asked Questions**

Q. If I receive a call from the school district saying my child has been identified as a direct contact, what should I do?

A. If your child has been identified as a direct contact, please refer to the [Mask to Stay/Test to Play guidance](#) on the COVID-19 webpage of the district's website.

Q. What if I have two or more students in a school building, how do I know which student has been identified as a direct contact?

A. Please call the school office during school hours to find out which student has been exposed or a close contact. The building principal or secretaries will be able to share that information with you.

Q. Who decides who quarantines?

A. The Health Department.

Q. How does the Health Department decide who quarantines?

A. They follow the guidance provided by the Ohio Department of Health per the Guidelines for Quarantine After Exposure in K-12 Classroom Settings flow chart.

Q. What if my child who was identified as a direct contact is vaccinated?

A. Vaccinated individuals can remain in normal in person classroom settings. please refer to the [Mask to Stay/Test to Play guidance](#) on the COVID-19 webpage of the district's website.

Q. If exposed, does my student-athlete have to test to play if his/her vaccination status is up-to-date?

A. No. It is recommended that they wear a mask indoors, as much as possible, for 10 days. Testing on day five after exposure is recommended.

Q. If exposed, does my student-athlete have to test to play if his/her vaccination status is NOT up-to-date?

A. Yes. He/She should test on the initial notification of exposure to COVID-19, if the result is negative, they can return to play. It is recommended that they wear a mask indoors, as much as possible, for 10 days. Testing on day five after exposure is recommended.
